So how is Lent going?

How many times do we have to clean up after the kids to be formally called a saint?

## What is the Ad-Hoc Choir???

So, our Ad-Hoc Choir is a choir that was created for a very specific purpose – to sing at our single worship service on January 31, 2010.

# Mid-week 2010 Lenten Service Schedule

**Wednesday, March 3, 2010**      **Apostle's Creed**

The creed helps us know more about the God we serve, reminding us of the nature and work of God, the sending of Jesus to redeem us, and the ongoing work of the Holy Spirit in life of the church and the believer.

**Wednesday, March 10, 2010**      **Lord's Prayer**

This service provides an opportunity to address prayer in general: why we pray and how it makes a difference in the life of a believer.

**Wednesday, March 17, 2010**      **Holy Baptism**

We use water every day. How might routine uses of water remind us of God's love toward us? In a world where we are led to believe that everything depends upon our own actions, this is a chance to affirm that in baptism, the action is God's. The event is significant not because we come to the font, but because God calls us to faith and now, in the water connected to God's promise, make us forgiven children of God.

**Wednesday, March 24, 2010**      **The Sacrament of the Altar**

This week we are reminded of the benefits of the meal and the nature of this sacrament. In many congregations this service comes as children or youth are preparing to receive holy communion for the first time, perhaps at the Maundy Thursday liturgy. This service provides a chance to encourage all who gather in worship to remember the benefits of holy communion in their lives. In this sense it can serve as a reminder to prepare oneself for this sacrament.

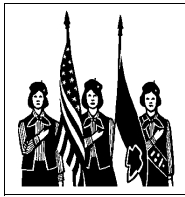
## ***God's Goldfish***

For approximately eight years United in Faith has received supplemental funds from Thrivent Financial for Lutherans. Thrivent is the Lutheran fraternal organization that consolidated the past fraternal programs, i.e. Aid Association for Lutherans and Lutheran Brotherhood, to further the blending of the past major Lutheran church bodies. This program gave us dollars for: UIF teen programs, supplement needed dollars for the church, and added dollars for our outreach ministries, i.e. the St. Cyprian's Food Pantry and the Night Ministry.

We received these additional monies based on a formula of how many members there were in our congregation, whether they held Thrivent products or not. All Lutheran congregations were eligible to receive these funds. As a "fraternal" organization the law mandates that Thrivent must give back a portion of earnings to its members. Time has allowed Thrivent to review how their programs have worked, and are now ready to begin new ways that they can serve Lutherans. The new criterion for available funds, which is in keeping with the "fraternal" definition, is: how many Thrivent members there are within the congregation.

As a financial program, Thrivent offers a variety of insurance and investment products. We learned that a number of people had such products when they were members of another church, i.e. at birth parents, who belonged to a different congregation, opened an insurance policy for their newborn. These people are identified with the other congregation which will affect any amounts now available to United in Faith.

We ask that if you hold a Thrivent product you call the Thrivent office to check and verify if you, and other members of your family, are listed. If not, please make the change. Only YOU can make that change.

Our Congregational Advocates are: Annette Cameron, Gayle Guzik and Shirley Canchola. We are still in the learning stages of the changes being made, but we do ask that you verify your membership by calling the Thrivent Fraternal Service number in Appleton: 1.800.236.3736. Ask for "Membership Verification".

Join us for a day of prayer, Bible study and dialog as we begin to discover together:

- **God's purpose for our church**  
Not *our* purpose! This is related to God's purpose in the world and includes the world as a focus. We are an instrument for God's work.
- **Guiding Principles for our ministries**  
We define our identity through values that God desires for us. The values are expressed as missional statements or guiding principles to which we will be held accountable. They relate directly to biblical values of Jesus and God's vision for the church and are only meaningful in the context of God's purpose.

Small groups will be formed to encourage the participation of everyone. Your attendance and input is very important.
