

#### What is Mental Health First Aid?

Mental Health First Aid is a course that teaches you how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders. The training gives you the skills you need to reach out and provide initial help and support to someone who may be developing a mental health or substance experiencing a crisis.

#### Mental Health First Aiders are...

Teachers, first responders and veterans. They're neighbors, parents and friends. They're people in recovery, and those supporting a loved one. They're First Ladies and Mayors. Mental Health First Aiders are anyone who wants to make their community healthier, happier and safer for all.

# FROM THE JUSTICE COMMITTEE

#### Is it true? Genuine? Correct? How do we know? What should we look for?

My dad used to say - believe nothing of what you hear and only half of what you see. Perhaps you remember the commercial - Is it live or is it Memorex? Today we deal with disinformation (false information to influence or obscure the truth) enabled by technology which allows its creation on a large scale by anyone. Why is certain information being pushed to us, where does it come from and how do we know what to look for to determine if it is true? The Chicago Public Library has short courses on The Basics of Disinformation and Disinformation on Social Media (see <u>chipublib.digitallearn.org</u>) to increase our awareness. It also published a discussion guide (pick up at your local library) with these topics on the basics of disinformation.

Information Overload: Anyone can create information and remain anonymous. Who or what (Bot?) is providing your information?

Identifying Disinformation designed to trick people: Is it untrue, too good to be true or just plain weird?

Types of Disinformation: Attention getting stories, misleading stories, propaganda to promote or discredit, conspiracy theories of secret plots to cover up truth, humor which mimics truth such as news but is made for entertaining, opinions and false promises.

How Disinformation is Created: Technology allows the creation and manipulation of photos and audio (deepfake) to misrepresent doing or saying something not actually done or said and social media distributes it widely.

Paying with your Data: Time on social media provides advertisers information on your likes, shares and other behavior so you can be microtargeted for product advertisements. Also can be used for political messages. Customize your social media with privacy settings.

Too Much Personalization: Social media platforms use algorithms to sort out and display posts that interest you because of similar and reinforcing beliefs.

Filter Bubbles and Biases: Filter bubbles expose you only to opinions and information that conforms to your beliefs. Biases make social media users vulnerable to disinformation because disinformation is crafted to exploit these biases. Do you share your biases with the information you share?

Perhaps today my dad would add - believe nothing on social media until you check out who/what sent it and why.
