This seminar was originally presented in 2009 and the seminar's updated information is posted on the United in Faith website. You will receive a copy of the documents at the seminar.



# Women's History Month

March is Women's History Month. What better time to remember the courageous and brilliant women that have come before us and some that are still with us.

Where to start. Of course, there is Mary. We have learned about her in Sunday School and church. Such an example of faith and at so young an age. There are numerous civil rights icons, one of which was Rosa Parks. Her refusal to give up her seat on a Montgomery, Alabama bus in 1955, helped launch the civil rights movement in the United States.

We have the 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment that granted women the right to vote which was ratified in 1920. It was a long fight (started in 1840) and unfortunately many women after that were still unable to vote because of discriminatory state voting laws.

Elizabeth Cady Stanton, Lucretia Mott, and Susan B. Anthony, were a few of the women we can thank for getting women the right to vote.

In 1972, Title IX became a federal law that prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex in education programs and activities. Not only was it a powerful tool for combating campus violence, it meant schools had to provide equal athletic opportunity, and equal opportunities in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) courses and programs. Women who fought for Title IX were Billie Jean King, Edith Louise Starrett Green, and Rep. Patsy Mink, to only name a few.

Did you know that the beautiful actress of Old Hollywood, Hedy Lamarr, was also an inventor? She shared her concept for "frequency hopping" with the U.S. Navy. Today, her innovation helped make possible a wide range of wireless communications technologies, including Wi-Fi, GPS, and Bluetooth. "The Only Woman in the Room" by Marie Benedict, is a book that describes her life before, during, and after World War II.

The theme for 2024 Women's History Month is "Women Who Advocate for Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion". There are so many great women to learn about. Please browse your library or bookstore to find a book or two to learn about women that have affected your life in ways that you may have not given thought to before.
