Currencies and Currents

Eric Law noted that a healthy congregation has six currencies or currents that run through them: Relationship, Gracious Leadership, Time and Place, Truth, Wellness, and Money. In Holy Currencies: Six Blessings for Sustainable Missional Ministries, he wrote that in a healthy church each of these currents swirl together in an endless cycle of pouring out and filling up. Much like a river or a creek join the rain from a storm and fill a lake, and heat in the summer or the breeze and the sun evaporate a pond, water is constantly in motion. Life in a church is much the same.

Fr. Law intentionally chose to overlay the concepts of energy and finance to capture a fullness of the economy of church. He puts forward it is only in the exchange and not the hoarding of these resources that can a congregation thrive.

As part of the interim process we will dive in and explore, uncover and interrogate the currents and currencies that flow though United in Faith on Irving Park Road. We will do this so we can together understand the depths of our gifts and strengths, as well as consider the shallow places that need to be filled up.

In the next weeks we will consider **Relationship**: "the internal and external networks of mutually respectful connections that leaders and members of a church have" (p. 11). We will consider how we are interconnected, how we influence our neighbors, and how our neighbors influence us. During Sunday worship we will begin with God in three persons as a relationship model for us and continue to explore the relationships among Jesus and the disciples. After church in late June we will gather around the lunch table to talk about our internal and external relationships. We will plumb our connections and note our disconnects. We will walk our neighborhood and meet our neighbors. We will reach out to the Alderman and check out city resources. We will consider the challenges to relationship that comes with living on Irving Park Road, as well as the rewards.

We have much to do! But over a meal or three and a cool glass of tea (or a moderate cup of wine) God's work is easy, and the burden is light. (I'm certain that is what Jesus meant to say.) Nevertheless, we will feed (pour out) and be fed (fill up) as we share God's bounty.

I am excited to enter this stage of reflection and imagination with you all! Blessings and Peace to you!!

Messy Church Conversation

On May 7th, fourteen of us gathered for lunch and twelve of us were able to stay and discuss our experiences of Messy Church (MC) at United in Faith. We shared candid conversation about our experiences and thoughts about moving forward. Our conversation was energetic and robust. We noted that a few people were out of town and unable to attend this conversation. Half of the people present had attended at least one of the MC events over the last year.

Many positive experiences were shared about how MC contributed to our wellness, our relationships, and gracious leadership here at United in Faith:

- "Makes us happy to do things for the environment and not waste valuable resources."
- "Provided clear connections between biblical principles and our lives."
- "It has provided an opportunity for us to reconnect; to kibitz with each other."
- "We are able to be with each other outside of church services."
- "Involved a few people who don't regularly attend worship."
- "There was some shared responsibility for the breakout tables."

It was generally noted that the primary energy came from Pastor Carla, and some concern that MC couldn't generate sustainable attendance. Folks shared their initial hopes that MC would generate more attendance of families with young children. Although, the representative from Messy Church named clearly that MC was not designed to be a magnet for children or a means to increase Sunday morning worship.

The energy of the people gathered reinforced that we are hungry for opportunities to gather, socially and spiritually. There was deep appreciation for guided spiritual conversations and relaxed social engagement.

The MC Leadership team will meet in June to continue to digest the feedback and discern how this feedback will shape our next steps. One of the conclusions I drew from this conversation was that people are hungry to reconnect in meaningful and stimulating ways. Messy Church may not be the perfect remedy to this hunger, but several of you felt fed by the opportunity to be together and try something new.

EV Chargers



United in Faith has been named as a finalist for a \$10,000 grant for Electric Vehicle Chargers as part of the Chicago Recovery Plan.

"The Chicago Recovery Plan is the City's plan to amplify once-in-ageneration federal funding to create an equity-based investment strategy to

catalyze a sustainable economic recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic. The funding under the Chicago Recovery Plan, which includes funding from the American Rescue Plan Act ("ARP") and over \$600 million in local bond funds, is allocated alongside all other available resources in the City budget to maximize this opportunity over the next 3-5 year funding period."

This process in ongoing, but we are excited to be part of this neighborhood rejuvenation program.
