

#### Comments:

2023 income from church operations is lower than spending by \$7,687 in March and lower by \$42,936 YTD.

Income includes \$1,727 in Special Estate gifts from:

Anita Perske - \$ 1,727 in January

General Investments returned a gain of \$3,216 for March & a gain of \$9,472 YTD. Educational Investments returned a gain of \$3,085 for March & a gain of \$9,968 YTD. Harriet Kurz Endowment returned a loss of (\$6,142) for March & a gain of \$9,417 YTD.

Total expenses for March are favorable to budget by \$7,309 and \$9,967 YTD due to Salary & Benefit costs being lower than budget by \$12,449 YTD and the YTD Building costs being higher than budget by \$3,456...

A special thanks to Audit Committee members Rich Guzick and Janeen Devine for having audited the 2020, 2021, & 2022 United in Faith's financial records in March 2023. They found that the financial records present fairly, in all material aspects, the financial condition of United in Faith as of the end of each of the 3 years audited.

# \_After 25 Years.....

As many of you may know, a committee has been busy at work sorting out the records of the eight predecessors as well as the 25 years of records for United in Faith's own history. Several gaps in our UIF records have been identified and we are looking for YOUR HELP in trying to locate the materials that are needed to have a fuller representation of our history.

There are three areas we are focusing on, although if you have materials that do not fit into these categories, we would still like to hear from you. The three things we are looking for are: Newsletters, Sunday Bulletins (and special services if you have them) and committee files. We do not need all years for the Newsletters and Bulletins, but for several years there is nothing or just a few on file: Bulletins: 1999-2006 and 2010-2013; Newsletters: 1999-2006, 2010-2013. For other years, we are missing a significant number of issues as well. If you have copies of either Newsletters or Bulletins, we are asking you to donate them to become part of the UIF Archives. We can provide more information on the exact issues needed, or you can turn them over and we will return any copies we already have on file.

The other group of records, committee files, have mainly remained in the hands of those who participated in that work. No one has ever requested those records to be turned over for the historical record. We have a strong collection of committee records from the early days of UIF, 1998-1999, but the remaining years are hit-and-miss. Again, you can offer your records and we can determine what years are already on file and return what is not needed for the archives.

We do have full finding aids or guides not only for UIF records, but for all records of the eight predecessors. Copies of these guides are available in the UIF administrative office. Every folder, volume, etc. can now be easily located as needed. For the predecessors, if you have materials you believe should also be in the archives, we are ready to accept them! Since we realize so many saved items could relate to your family's history, once again, you can request that materials already represented in the archives be returned to you.


