

Friends,

Spring is doing its thing. Trees are full, flowers are outdoing themselves, and the grass is back to needing a mow. After a long gray stretch, color is back. The earth is waking up—and we're invited to do the same.

And yet, I know that not everything feels brand new. Some of us are carrying worry, loss, or the kind of tired that even spring can't fully shake. If that's where you are, you're not alone. The resurrection we celebrated at Easter isn't a quick fix—it's a slow and steady promise. God is doing something new, but sometimes it starts small.

Isaiah reminds us: "Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?" Sometimes the answer is "not yet." And that's okay. New things take time to root. That doesn't mean they're not happening. The Spirit is already at work—in our questions, in our healing, in the spaces we don't expect. Sometimes resurrection looks like one honest conversation, one deep breath, one brave "yes" to what's next.

So this May, I invite you to notice. Not just the tulips or the extra daylight—but the quiet signs of God doing a new thing in you, in us, in our neighborhood. Where is something beginning again?

At United in Faith, we're continuing to listen—to God and to one another. In worship, in conversation, in community events, we're looking for the Spirit's movement and asking: *What's God growing here?* What are we being invited to join?

We don't have to have it all figured out. We just need to keep showing up, with open hands and expectant hearts. That's what spring does. That's what resurrection asks of us. And that's what we'll keep doing together.

2025 income from church operations excluding Special Gifts is lower than spending by \$17,145 in March and lower by \$57,481 YTD.

Investments returned a loss of \$25,242 for March & a loss of \$5,664 YTD. Educational Investments returned a loss of \$8,135 for March & a loss of \$1,544 YTD.

Total expenses for March are unfavorable to budget by \$1,837 and are favorable to budget by \$8,055 YTD due to the Salaries YTD costs being lower than budget by \$3,625; the Ministry YTD costs being \$102 higher than budget; the Administrative YTD costs being \$397 higher than budget, the YTD Building costs being higher than budget by \$3,461; & the Ministry Directors' YTD costs being lower than budget by \$8,390.
