In June and July, we have considered the currency of relationship. How relationship flow to connect us with each other, our neighborhood, and our ministry. In August and September, we turn to being well.

"Wellness: Being healthy physically, socially, economically, ecologically, and spiritually within a church, the neighborhood, the town/city, nation, or the earth, especially as the result of deliberate effort. Sustainable wellness requires regenerative and recirculatory flow of material, human, financial and natural resources."

Being healthy doesn't just happen. It requires deliberate effort. Over the next weeks we will assess our health, personally and congregationally, and how our health contributes to the health of our community. Such exploration stirs things up, it provides energy for others and in turn that energy flows back to invigorate us.

In August we will continue to build relationships to increase our social health. So that we can build relationships across differences without fear or defensiveness. Freeing us to live into loving our neighbor as ourselves. We will explore the economics of being healthy in this place, and how God's divine economy can more fully be claimed in our expression of God's work here.

In September, we will celebrate The Seasons of Creation in worship and step outside and into the forest preserve. As we consider the ecological health of the intersection of Irving Park Road and United in Faith, we will seek ways to actively increase our health and decrease our ecological footprint.

Throughout all these conversations and interactions we will seek God's direction for us. Listening for God's voice and the voice of our neighbors.

This is the telephone help line for the Chicago chapter of the National Alliance for Mental Health. This organization started in 1979 and has been supporting individuals and groups with mental illness assistance and resources. The help line is the heart of their program and can be used to find emotional support and help to find resources for treatment, housing, legal and more. Callers may be the person in need, or you can call on behalf of a loved one. When you call, you will be talking to a mental health professional. Calling hours are seven days a week: M-F, 8am-9pm, S-S, 8am-5pm. Your call is both free and confidential.

NAMI also provides classes, training and support groups. Other information you will find on the website includes information: symptoms, types of disorders and fact sheets for in-patient, out-patient and community-based supports. You may get the information you need there, or it will prepare you for calling the help line.

Another important resource began this year **988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline** is the three -digit dialing code that will connect callers in crisis to trained counselors that will listen, understand how their problems are affecting them, provide support, and connect them to resources if necessary. Just as you might call 911 for medical or safety assistance, call 988 for mental illness assistance.

#### Comments:

2023 income from church operations is lower than spending by \$12,306 in June and lower by \$77,926 YTD.

Income includes \$1,727 in Special Estate gifts from:

Anita Perske - \$1,727 in January 2023

Investments returned a gain of \$13,041 for June & a gain of \$39,511 YTD. Educational Investments returned a gain of \$11,551 for June & a gain of \$18,814 YTD.

Total expenses for June are favorable to budget by \$3,836 and \$17,327 YTD due to Salary & Benefit costs being lower than budget by \$10,319 YTD, the Administrative costs being lower than budget by \$2,183, and the YTD Building costs being lower than budget by \$2,561.

We see that our wellbeing is interwoven with the creation's wellbeing. We rejoice in this opportunity to care for our common home and the sisters and brothers who share it.


This year, we share special Sundays that focus on:
