

I needed to hear those words and to share my need. I also need to share it briefly with you. In early September I was diagnosed with Endometrial Cancer. I will have laparoscopic surgery on October 2<sup>nd</sup> and need to be away through October 16<sup>th</sup>. During this time Rev. Julie Boleyn will be covering for me. If all goes as planned, I should expect to be well recovered by November 1<sup>st</sup>. The largest impact of cancer on me has been a distinct drag on my energy level. I have been growing increasingly tired. My surgeon is optimistic that there will be limited interventions after the surgery, due to early detection and slow growth. I am relying on my faith and true belief that God has plenty for me to do before advent this year.

I deeply covet your prayers and am grateful for all of your support. I look forward to our gathering October 29th in celebration of our life together as a church and as a community.

#### **Caring For God's World**

When you need - or just want - a product or service how do you evaluate what is available? The usual criteria are:

**Quality**: Is it good, better or best and which do I really need? What do the reviews and recommendations say? How durable is it? Can it be repaired if needed? What is it made of? Is it made in the USA? What is the reputation of the manufacturer/provider for standing by their products? Is the product/ service harmful or dangerous? Is the product age appropriate? Are services started on time and completed on schedule and on budget?

**Price**: What is a fair price? Is the price appropriate for the quality? Are there quantity discounts? Who has the best price? Is cheapest always best? Are there delivery and return charges? Is a coupon available? Will it be going on sale soon?

**Availability**: Is it in stock? Is it available locally? If ordered online how long will delivery take? How soon do I need it? How long can I wait for it? When is a service person available?

Another criterion becoming more popular due to our heightened sensitivity is to look at the **social/environmental consciousness** of the manufacturer/service provider. Is the company ethical? Are they good neighbors? Is there a diverse work force – hiring, promotion, leadership, on the Board of Directors? How are employees treated? Are employees well trained? Are they paid fairly and provided with a safe work environment? Is the environment harmed during the manufacturing or service? Does the company recycle? Is packaging eco-friendly? Are a portion of the profits used to help make the world a better place?

Here are some examples of companies 'doing good'. Google 'environmentally conscious companies' and 'socially responsible companies' for more suggestions. You can also check out The Human Rights Campaign (HRC) website for companies that are LGBTQ friendly, including in their corporate offices. The HRC has a set of criteria, Corporate Equality Index, that must be met to get a perfect score.

Who Gives A Crap (toilet paper): directs a portion of profits to building toilets around the world

Dave's Killer Bread: hires ex-felons

Bombas: donates a pair of socks for each pair bought

Toms: donates a pair of shoes for each pair bought

FLOR (floor tiles) and some sneaker shoe companies: take back products after use for recycling

LuminAID (portable solar lights): Give Light/Get Light program to donate solar lights to places without electricity due to natural disasters or underdevelopment

A socially/environmentally responsible company may just change the way you look at price and the price you are willing to pay!
