KIDS IN WORSHIP

United in Faith has several guiding principles that help shape our congregation's plans and missional intentions. These include:

Jesus is Lord and Savior Reflect God's Love Pray and listen for God's guidance Continue to strengthen faith Include all in God's work Meet people where they are

As we seek to figure out how to best live out this call to "include all in God's work" and "meet people where they are," we've realized that the one-sizefits-all approach to children in worship is not helpful for children of today. Anyone who grew up in an era of "children should be seen and not heard" may chafe against the newer ways of welcoming little children in worship – children who make noise and even squirm frequently! Often, younger folks just need an opportunity to stretch or to fidget or to draw – while they are soaking in the Christian message(s) all around them. Sometimes kids engage with worship in ways that do not look like constant attention. Sometimes kids have questions about worship – during worship! Sometimes kids hear a word they don't understand and their curiosity leads them to wonder - or leads their minds to wander. But growth in faith in God can come through any of these natural pathways of curiosity.

In Deuteronomy 6, the gathered community of faith was called to love God with all their heart, soul, and might. They were invited to "keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise." While we often use these words to speak to the responsibility of parents in raising their children in the faith, I want to use these words to remind us that the full community is really responsible to keep God's word alive in the gathered community – for the young, old, and everything in between.

Recently, we've added two very visible ways of welcoming children into our worship space:

FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR CARLA, CONTINUED...

Our sanctuary Prayground is shaping up nicely (baby swing, bouncer, toddler picnic table, quiet activities by the wall). This provides a visible and physical way for us to support and encourage families with very young children who would rather keep their little ones in the worship space with them rather than relocate to the nursery. The (non-staffed) nursery will still be an option for those who find it helpful. But the Prayground will be a location within the sanctuary space where children can move while still being in worship.

We've added five copies of the Spark Story Bible to the hymnal cart. We've also started adding page numbers within the bulletin whenever we find the assigned lessons with parallel Spark Story Bible stories. These are especially offered for families with children, but all are welcome to explore those illustrated stories in order to learn and grow in faith. The Spark Story Bible is good for very young children (bright pictures and easy to understand words) and even as they learn to read.

We've had Sunday children's bulletins available for several years. Now copies of those children's bulletins are kept near the sign-in sheet and worship bulletins. There are several clipboard-type boards with children's bulletins and several cups of crayons. Feel free to offer these to little kid visitors (if they don't pick them up on the way in).

In the months ahead, you'll probably see different opportunities and events offered to invite and welcome and show children that they are valuable members of our community. We have discussed the possibility of offering Messy Church (an event outside of Sunday morning that incorporates inter-generational interactive scripture-based activities/celebration/meal) or something like this in the future.

When we welcome a newly baptized person to the church, we say: "We welcome you into the body of Christ and into the mission we share: join us in giving thanks and praise to God and bearing God's creative and redeeming word to all the world." When we baptize a baby, I often think...how can they give thanks and praise to God and bear God's word? But then I realize that every single thing that they do can be giving thanks and praise. They bear God's word by being exactly who they are within our community of faith. Their noises and squirminess are a part of our shared community of faith and our communal sound of praise (a "joyful" noise as Psalm 98:4 calls it).

1 Corinthians 12:12 "For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ." I invite you to take this call seriously to invite and welcome younger members of our worshipping community. We all have a role to play in welcoming people of all ages into the worshipping, praising (and even squirming) body of Christ.

Justice Ministry has been seeking a book about Missing/Murdered Indigenous Women. We have also been reading and discussing several graphic novels. This month's book combines both.



Saturday, June 18th at 3pm - If I Go Missing (by Brianna Jonnie)

Book Description: If I Go Missing is derived from excerpts of a letter that went viral and was also the basis of a documentary film. In her letter, Jonnie calls out the authorities for neglecting to immediately investigate missing Indigenous people and urges them to not treat me as the Indigenous person I am proud to be if she were to be reported missing.

Indigenous artist Neal Shannacappo provides the artwork. Through his illustrations, he imagines a situation in which a young Indigenous woman does disappear, portraying the reaction of her community, her friends, the police, and media.

Ways to donate to United in Faith... While You Are Doing What You Normally Do!

("passive" fundraising opportunities)

If you shop at Amazon: Go to smile.amazon.com before you put things in your Amazon cart. On the top left corner (once you are signed in), it will say "Supporting United in Faith." If it does not yet say "Supporting United in Faith," you'll need to search on "United in Faith Lutheran Church, Chicago" (we are listed as Protestant). Click "select". As of March 2022, United in Faith has received \$360+ since we began receiving Amazon Smile donations.

If you have Thrivent investment or insurance products:

Go to thrivent.com. Sign in with your username and password (or create a login if you haven't before). This username is not the same as your Thrivent account #. Click on "membership overview." You will see several options when you scroll down: "Thrivent Action Teams," "Thrivent Choice," and "Habitat for Humanity and Thrivent Partnership."

To designate Thrivent Choice dollars, click on Direct Choice Dollars (under Thrivent Choice). You can direct all or some of your Thrivent Choice dollars. Search for United in Faith Lutheran Church, Chicago. Once you have directed Thrivent Choice dollars there, they will now be listed in your Thrivent Choice organizations. You could also periodically use these Thrivent Choice Dollars to benefit Lutheran Outdoor Ministries Center (Oregon, IL) or Lutheran Social Services of Illinois (LSSI) or Lutheran School of Theology in Chicago (LSTC). Once you select how many Thrivent Choice dollars and what organization they will go to, there will be one more check box ("I acknowledge that Choice Dollars® are intended to complement, not replace, my continued personal donation to organizations and that I agree to the Thrivent Choice® program terms & conditions, including that Thrivent Financial may provide my name and address to this organization.") before you can submit. Your Thrivent Choice dollars will be automatically deposited to UIF (with all the other choice dollars from other members).

Another Thrivent benefit that all Thrivent members have access to is Thrivent Action Teams. Thrivent Action Teams are (up to) \$250 grants meant to provide seed money for a community project or a fundraising event. All Thrivent members can sponsor 2 Thrivent Action Teams per year. Your application for a Thrivent Action Team grant might be approved or denied (usually they want to see multiple people working on it, and that they are funding more than just a one-time purchase of supplies). You can always re-word and re-apply if your grant is not approved. We've used Thrivent Action Team grants for English Conversations class supplies, Eagle Scout projects, LOMC Labyrinth Work Day supplies, and assisting a refugee family. Thrivent "Live Generously" t-shirts and Thrivent thank you notes can be ordered through the Thrivent Action Team grant application.

CARING FOR GOD'S CREATION...

"When you walk through a restored wildlife habitat—even a small patch—you become a witness to the abundance of life and goodness in God's creation," said Donna Pellegrin, a 12-year member of the congregation who led the youth group's 2018 butterfly garden launch. "Every creature is in symphony, and you can't teach the creation story any better way. When we teach Genesis and creation in Sunday school, inside sitting around tables, it's not the same as being a witness. You cannot help but meet God in nature."

CHURCH RENEWAL FIELD TRIP #1:

Join Pastor Carla for a Messy Church Field Trip on Sunday, June 12th from 4:30-6:30 at Northfield Community Church (400 Wagner Rd., Northfield, IL - near Glenview - not far off the Edens Expy).
